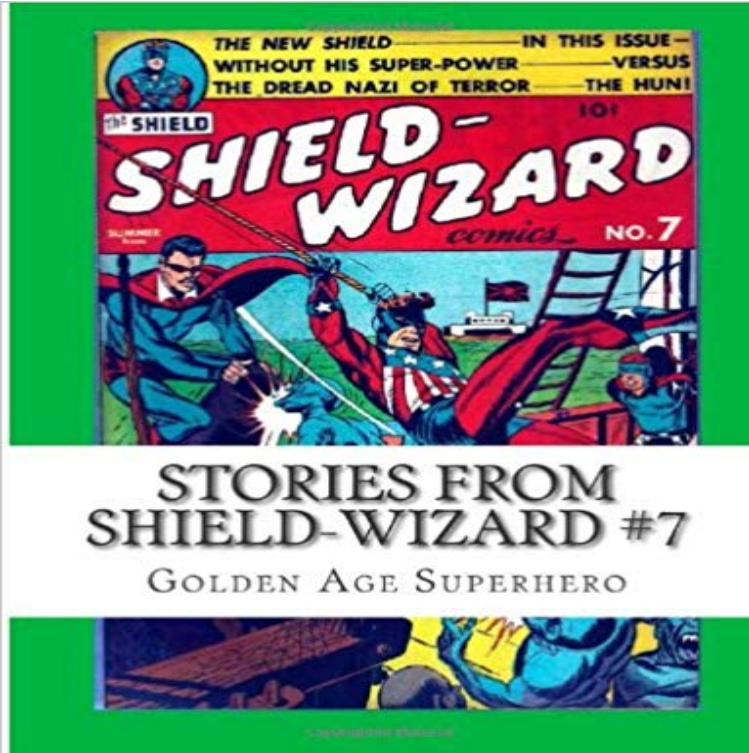


## Stories From Shield- Wizard #7: Golden Age Superhero
